

## **Case Report Outline**

Your report should be a minimum of four pages and a maximum of seven pages. For the application due September 30, 2017, case reports may use the page limit listed or a character limit with a minimum of 10,000 characters and a maximum of 15,000 characters (*including spaces*). Lab reports and references should be attached as appendices and will not count towards either the page or character limits proscribed.

Reports must be double-spaced, in Times New Roman font size 12, with a margin of 1.0" on all sides on 8 1/2" x 11" paper.

- 5. Patient Signalment
  - a. Species

- 6. Patient History
  - a. Chief Complaint
  - b. Current History
  - c. Current Medication (including dosages if known)
  - d. Pertinent Previous History
- 7. Complete patient status upon presentation
  - a. Physical Examination
- 8. Weight in kg
- 9. Temperature
- 10. Pulse rate +/or heart rate
- 11. Respiratory rate + character
- 12. Level of Consciousness
  - a. Body Systems Review of Abnormal Findings
  - b. Problem List
- 13. Veterinarian's Differential Diagnosis
- 14. Initial Assessment of Prognosis
- 15. Initial Diagnostics & Results Discussion of Test Selection, Alternatives or Suggested Procedures, Goals of Therapy
  - a. Laboratory
  - b. Diagnostic Imaging
  - c. Procedures



- 16. Discussion of Case Management on a daily basis
  - a. Subjective (for example: depressed, responsive, etc.)
  - b. Objective (relevant diagnostic/lab results)
  - c. Assessment
  - d. Plan
  - e. Appetite, Eliminations
  - f. Vitals
  - g. Medications Dosage and Reason for Use
  - h. Treatments Discussion of Therapeutic Value
- 17. Advanced Nursing & Technical Skills Performed
- 18. Advanced Nursing & Technical Skills Assisted With
- 19. Final Outcome
  - a. If discharged:
    - i. Dispensed Medications and Dispensed Diets
    - ii. Home Nursing Instruction
  - b. If euthanized or expired, provide necropsy results if available
- 20. Discussion of Case:
  - a. Pathophysiology, as it relates to this patient
  - b. Disease Process, as it relates to this patient
  - c. Etiology, as it relates to this patient

Provide supplemental information in Appendices attached to the report. These materials (images, video, lab charts/reports, diagnostic reports, etc.) will not count towards your page or character count.
